# **SHOW DETAILS**

Solo show, involving dance, spoken word, and some karaoke style singing. The performance strongly integrates both sound and projected images.

Running time 75 minutes, no interval

A foyer installation of Naomi Ota's work is optional.

#### STAGE

En Trance is best performed in a studio style, intimate space but can be performed in a standard proscenium arch configuration.

Minimum stage dimensions are

13 m wide 9m deep 4.5m high

En Trance was originally performed in the Tower Theatre at The Malthouse, Melbourne. This space had a black brick wall which was used to project onto, a double door which was utilised during the performance and several ladders mounted to the wall. In remounting En Trance it is important to determine how to replace these features.

Back wall If the back wall is black or dark this can be used as a projection surface. In

the event that this is not suitable black drapes can be used (see plans).

Doorway Ideally this is a custom built doorway structure (see plans) but this dependant

on the depth of the stage.

Ladders There are several options to replace the 2 ladders used in En Trance. These

include A-frame ladders (wooden), 6 step stairs, small scaffolding towers,

vertical ladders attached to the grid etc.

There are many and varied approaches to solve the staging of En Trance – please contact En Trance to talk about what options would work best for your venue.

## **SET REQUIREMENTS**

## Venue to provide

5 x kabuki bars

- 3 x 3m wide
- 1 x 4m
- 1 x 2m

All rigging for kabuki bars (see plans for information)

Black plinth or box - ideal dimensions 1.2m (h) x 0.8m (w) x 0.4m (d)

All masking as required (flat black wool preferred)

NOTE: In the past Kabuki bars have been sourced from Malthouse Theatre and CLS in Melbourne.

## **AV REQUIREMENTS**

TV for Punk Medusa scene

## Venue to provide

- 3 x projectors (see projection plan)
- 3 x projector shutters to be operated side of stage
- 2 x professional level DVD players
- 1 x vision mixer
- 1 x matrix switcher or 3 way switch

## **FACILITIES**

Company to provide

All costumes as required

#### Venue to provide

1 x dressing room for female performer

- Access to showers, toilets, hot and cold running water
- Sufficient lighting, tables, chairs, bins and mirrors
- Clean towels available throughout the season
- Access to clean filtered water for the duration of the rehearsal and run

Access to wardrobe facilities

- Access to washing and drying facilities
- · Access to an iron and ironing board
- Costume racks and coat hangers

## **FREIGHT**

The freight consists of

5 x kabuki curtains (in 2 large bags)

TV

1 x plastic tub of assorted props

1 x medium suitcase of costumes

Total weight is approximately 70kgs

Can travel by excess baggage (presenter to pay costs)
